

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

DELIGHT IN DANVILLE

If you are looking for small-town charm mixed with a polished yet relaxed vibe, you can't go wrong in Danville. The vibrant downtown features specialty shops, regional theater productions and art shows, wine bars, and top-notch restaurants. Venture away from the hub, and you'll find that Danville is also home to Tao House (the one-time residence of playwright Eugene O'Neill, where his plays live on during the annual Eugene O'Neill Festival), along with numerous hiking trails, parks and open spaces.

DIVE INTO DUBLIN

One of the fastest-growing cities in the United States, Dublin is bursting with restaurants, shops, nightlife and activities. It has an impressively diverse culinary scene and a wealth of recreational opportunities for fun-seekers of all ages, including golf, bowling, ice-skating, go-kart racing, and even a water park and trampoline park. There's history here, too: Witness Dublin's annual St. Patrick's Day Festival, which celebrates the Irish heritage of the city's founders. Look for shamrocks adorning city street signs in honor of those early immigrants from the Emerald Isle.

LIVE IT UP IN LIVERMORE

Forget Napa and Sonoma. California's oldest wine-growing region, Livermore is a world-class destination with dozens of wineries-most of which have been family owned and operated for generations. Livermore is not just for wine aficionados, though. There is a wide selection of craft breweries and trendy restaurants, along with plenty of kid-friendly attractions including mini golf, super slides and laser tag. Shoppers flock to the San Francisco Premium Outlets and specialty boutiques downtown. Sample Livermore's rich cultural offerings by catching a show at the Bankhead Theater.

PLAY IN PLEASANTON

Once a Wild West hideout, contemporary Pleasanton offers a plethora of dining, retail options and outdoor recreation. Shopaholics can browse Stoneridge Shopping Center and Main Street boutiques, while food lovers have their pick of restaurants featuring cosmopolitan fare from around the globe. Consistently ranked one of the most desirable places to live in the state, Pleasanton has a happening city center, along with 1,200 acres of parks, open space and trails. Culture lovers can enjoy engaging performances at the Firehouse Arts Center year-round.

The distinctive culture of the Tri-Valley area dates back centuries. Its history, filled with frontierspeople and immigrants, has fostered a unique spirit of local pride, collaboration and innovation that lives on to this day.



HISTORY COMES ALIVE

IN THE TRI-VALLEY, EVERYTHING IS DEEPLY CONNECTED TO THE PAST.

Historical insights can be gleaned in every town throughout the Tri-Valley. For instance, the **Dublin Heritage Park & Museums** is a 10-acre area that is home to **Pioneer Cemetery**; the region's oldest Catholic church, **St. Raymond** (1859); the **Murray Schoolhouse**; and the **Kolb House**, a 1910 Craftsman bungalow that now operates as a museum. **Dublin Camp Parks Military History Center** preserves the old military base, which was known as Fleet City during World War II.

In Danville, an oak tree thought to be more than 350 years old stands on Diablo Road, and its likeness serves as the town's logo. The historic **1891 Southern Pacific Depot** nearby houses the culturally rich **Museum of the San Ramon Valley**.

In Pleasanton, sign up for a historical walking tour with the **Museum on Main**. Don't miss **Alviso Adobe**, a community park that offers a rich interpretive history of the Amador Valley, from its Native American roots to the present day.

Even the wines here are steeped in tradition. Wente Vineyards, which started in 1883, produced the first labeled chardonnay, sauvignon blanc and semillon in the country. Today, most of the chardonnay grapes in California descend from Wente clones. Concannon Vineyard, founded the same year, made one of the first Bordeaux-style wines in California. Clones of its California cabernet provided the basis for the cab frenzy of the past 40 years.

In addition, the area boasts numerous historic homes, such as Pleasanton's **Century House**—which is more than 150 years old—and **Ravenswood** in Livermore (available for weddings and events).





MADE IN THE TRI-VALLEY

TAKE HOME UNIQUE PRODUCTS FROM THESE LOCAL PURVEYORS.

The Tri-Valley has been a hotbed of innovation and creativity for decades, celebrated as being the home of some of California's very first viticultural pioneers, world-renowned scientific researchers and even a Nobel Prize winner. Today it continues to attract a variety of quality artists, farmers, chefs, winemakers, brewers and makers who cultivate, curate and craft their locally made goods. When visiting the Tri-Valley, stop by some of the following makers, and take a piece of this unique region with you.

- > Artisanal honey is the perfect addition to your favorite snack, warm beverage or charcuterie board. Gerard'z Honeybees not only produces its raw honey naturally from native wildflowers, it also provides valuable cross-pollination to regional food growers. Get a behind-the-scenes peek at introductory or advanced beekeeping workshops, often hosted at a Livermore Valley winery. The honey is available for purchase at a variety of wineries, breweries and boutiques or online. gerardzhoneybees.com
- > Sutherland Distilling Company attributes its award-winning spirits to its focus on sustainability and passion for sourcing local ingredients. Sutherland's 90-proof Apricot Brandy uses 18 pounds of apricots per bottle and took home a Double Gold medal at the San Francisco World Spirit Competition in 2017. sutherlanddistilling.com

- apples, truffles, chocolate barks, dipped fruits and more, danvillechocolates.com
- Latina-owned and operated Sweet Hope Soap Co. specializes in all-natural handcrafted soaps, shampoo bars, face masks and other body products made with sustainable ingredients. Find its small-batch products at makers fairs, area boutiques and online with local pickup or shipping options. sweethopesoapco.com
- > If you are looking for more natural beauty products, stop at Good Common Sense Naturals in Pleasanton for organic, nontoxic items made with ingredients grown and roasted in-house. With a keen focus on sustainability, this local maker has cut out parabens, detergents and fragrances; goods are packaged in BPA-free recyclable containers. goodcommonsense.com
- Olivina Ranch-established in 1881 in what's now Livermore Valley Wine Country-makes extra-virgin olive oil from olives grown, harvested, milled and bottled on the historic estate. Olivina Olive Oil is used by several area restaurants and sold at a variety of retailers throughout the Tri-Valley. theolivina.com

WINE WHEELS

The Livermore Wine Trolley tour takes visitors to three wineries for a full wine-tasting flight paired with small bites as part of the Sip and Savor Wine Pairing Tour. Other special offerings are the Taste of the Tri-Valley Food Tour-in which guests sample menus from three noted restaurants-and the Sip and Paint Wine Tour, which includes a painting session at Pinot's Palette, a box lunch from Ofelia's Kitchen, and tastings at Concannon Vineyards and Rios Lovell Winery. The trolley is also available for private charter. livermorewinetrolley.com

GOLDEN AGE

The Golden State Trolley has set its sights on blending "yesterday's nostalgia with today's modern luxury" ever since it began traversing Bay Area roads in January 2019. The Golden State Trolley can be rented as a private charter; shuttle; or transportation for weddings, corporate outings or other events. goldenstatetrolley.com





2 MPH

All you really need for exploring the region is a pair of comfortable shoes and a game plan. Check out Livermore's scenic **Greenville Road**, which boasts six vineyards within an easy, milelong stroll, or **Tesla Road**, home to **Wente**, **Concannon**, **Steven Kent** and other well-known wineries. Take a 2.5-hour stroll through downtown and sample the city's dining scene with **Livermore Foodie Tours**. For a dark glimpse into the region's history, the **Museum on Main** in Pleasanton offers spooky **Ghost Walk** guided tours of downtown Pleasanton's most haunted sites in October for Halloween. *livermorefoodtours.com*, *museumonmain.org*

12 MPH

Zip along the grapevines on electric bikes from Livermore's **Pedego Electric Bikes**. Livermore's Jim Buck recommends this ride from the storefront: "Head east on Patterson Pass, alongside the Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory. On Greenville Road, turn right and head up the gradual hill. As you peak, you can see the Livermore Valley Wine Country as it opens up to you. At the crossroads of Tesla and Greenville, head straight across Tesla toward the McGrail, Charles R, Bent Creek, Big White House, Caddis and 3 Steves tasting rooms." 40+ MPH

Black Tie Transportation offers luxury sedans and SUVs, limovans, and executive coaches to give you a feel for the region without the hassle of driving. Custom tours of Tri-Valley wineries (and breweries) come with recommendations from its in-house wine specialist. *blacktietrans.com*



BRIGHT IDEA

The planet's longest-burning light bulb, according to *Guinness World Records*, is a humble bulb inside Livermore Fire Station No. 6 on East Avenue. Turned on in 1901, the bulb—nicknamed the **Centennial Light**—has been switched off only four times since then. Originally a 60-watt light, it's dimmed but still hanging on at 4 watts. Visitors are welcome, depending on the availability of firefighters to let them inside; the bulb is also visible through one of the station's windows. *centennialbulb.org*



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

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

THE CLASSICS

The Riata Diner & Tavern in Livermore reflects the area's pioneer past with Wild West-inspired decor and memorabilia-and offers hearty breakfast dishes. For more quirky furnishings and no-frills food to start your day, check out Jim's Country Style Restaurant in Pleasanton. The popular diner (there can be a line at the door on weekends) features wood-paneled walls, street signs as art and mouthwatering all-day breakfast items.

Follow the locals to Danville's Sideboard Neighborhood Kitchen and Coffee Bar, a premier cafe that features deluxe brands such as Sightglass, Temple and more. Indulge yourself with an order of beignets to go. Crumbs is another Danville community gathering place that is popular with all ages. Fill up on sizable plates including crab benedict, country fried steak and eggs, chicken and waffles, and ube pancakes.

For breakfast like Mom used to make, look no further than Denica's Real Food Kitchen in Livermore and Dublin for decadent offerings of favorites like waffles, omelets and giant


Take your morning meal to the next level at The Press cafe in Pleasanton and Livermore. Tasty dishes such as an avocado and egg toastini are served on a wooden plank; be sure to note the display of antique coffee makers. Work on your Great American Novel over a mug brewed from Chromatic Coffee Co.

Open early on the weekends (take advantage to avoid the crowds), Mayflower Restaurant in Dublin creates a transporting experience with its inviting atmosphere and authentic dim sum menu. If you're feeling adventurous, head over to Blossom Bee, also in Dublin. The Thai fusion creperie puts a twist on breakfast food with dishes like the Dublin Rancheros crepe with grilled chicken and scrambled eggs.

Baci Bistro & Bar, in downtown Pleasanton. specializes in steak, seafood and Italian cuisine, but the weekend brunch menu is something really special. Try the fried egg avocado toast or steak tostadas.

Enjoy the sweet scent of Tri-Valley mornings at Nonni's Bistro, an open-air, European-style eatery in Pleasanton. Both breakfast and brunch are served on weekends, giving plentiful takes on the morning meal.

Opened in 1997, Blue Agave Club was the first restaurant in Pleasanton to showcase Mexican cuisine. More than 20 years later, the popular spot is well known for its 100 percent blue agave tequila margaritas as well as its enchanting outdoor dining experience.

POWER LUNCH

For authentic Southeast Asian cuisine. Experience Burma in Pleasanton has got you covered. Dining family style is recommended-and the best way to sample multiple dishes-so grab some friends and dig into the pumpkin pork stew or lemon grass tofu. In Livermore, Uncle Yu's at the Vinevard's remarkable wine list perfectly complements Szechuan staples and delectable dim sum.

If you like some action with your meal, try Da Boccery in Livermore. In addition to its menu featuring pizzas, sandwiches and salads, the eatery offers bocce courts, shuffleboard and axe throwing, among other games.

Prefer to kick back and relax? Danville **Brewing Co.** is your spot. The restaurant boasts exceptional pub food paired with award-winning beers like 925 Blonde and Chux DIPA. For more comfort food in Danville, try **Locanda Ravello**. The eatery embraces the Amalfi Coast with bright dishware and hearty pizzas and pastas, while superior service makes it even easier to savor the luxurious Italian fare.

For a taste of something different, visit The Banana Garden Malaysian Cuisine in Dublin. The flavorful Malaysian menu includes boldly spiced items like belachan string beans and tender chicken satay, while the saltwater aquarium and painted palm trees create a soothing tropical vibe. Also in Dublin is Burma! Burma!, where dishes like the tea leaf salad, curry chicken and garlic noodles are highlights of the robust Burmese

For a culinary adventure south of the border, Livermore's family-owned **Posada** is a solid bet. A contemporary take on Southwestern food, Posada is the perfect lunchtime stop before a day of wine tasting.

THE BIG MEAL

THE CLASSICS

The Tri-Valley has its share of trusted eateries, including **Terra Mia Ristorante Italiano** in Livermore, which serves authentic Italian fare such as house-made pasta, pizza and other favorites in a welcoming space. Newer to the Livermore scene is **Range Life**. The Michelin-rated restaurant is located in a restored 1800s carriage house-mixing urban and rustic sensibility in food and atmosphere. The seasonally changing menu draws influences from diverse cuisines, and its craft cocktails are an excellent way to round off an evening on the town.

Pleasanton's 1950s steakhouse **Hap's Original** allows for dining in style and comfort. While steak is most definitely the focus here, with the finest dry-aged cuts of beef, the house-made sauces and dressings help elevate already scrumptious dishes.



WORLDLY WONDERS

Authenticity can be tasted in every bite at 11th Tiger Thai Street Café in Danville. Featuring a blend of street food from various parts of Thailand, 11th Tiger cooks up an extensive and enticing menu of noodles, curries, small bites, soups and more in an intimate space.

Get a taste of Jordan at Livermore's **Petra**. This family-owned eatery is excellent for those trying Middle Eastern cuisine for the first time as well as more experienced eaters. The excellent complimentary cardamom tea and pita are also worth mentioning.


The family behind Pleasanton's **Korean Village** wants you to feel at home in their little village. With congenial service and lovingly cooked, authentic Korean meals like fish cake ramen and soft tofu soup, you'll likely find they've achieved their goal.

Ultrafresh sushi and high-end Japanese fare can be found at **Amakara** in Dublin, where chef Eddy Imano takes as much pride in his colorful presentations as he does in his delicious rolls.

Cocina Hermanas' spacious patio on Danville's bustling Hartz Avenue is an ideal spot to sip a margarita while enjoying Mexican fare spiced with Northern California influences. Using traditional culinary techniques, Cocina Hermanas serves popular street food—think tacos, flautas and grilled corn on the cob—and family-style dishes made from local, sustainable ingredients.

The Yellow Chilli in Danville, from celebrity chef Sanjeev Kapoor, offers an outstanding gastronomic tour of India in an elegant space.

Bridges Restaurant & Bar is a paragon in the Danville culinary world, but classic doesn't mean stuffy. The polished, upscale restaurant, which was featured as a location in the 1993 comedy *Mrs. Doubtfire*, has maintained its buzz-worthy status by fine-tuning its fresh California cuisine with Asian influences.



HOT SPOTS

Dublin's **Berevino Cucina & Wine Bar** specializes in old-world Italian cuisine and an extensive wine list; it's a great place to have a romantic dinner for two or to sip reds with a big group of friends.

Tucked into Livermore's downtown district, Sons of Liberty Alehouse stands out. The menu is typical of gastropubs, but the execution is a cut above—with main courses that offer some unusual complementary sides and take full advantage of fresh, seasonal ingredients.

Sabio on Main, with its delectable dishes and large bar, has become a go-to spot in Pleasanton. Try the three- or five-course pre fixe dinner or treat yourself to executive chef Francis Hogan's 10-course tasting menu for the ultimate dining experience.

Elia is another sophisticated standout in Pleasanton. Thoughtful takes on Mediterranean favorites such as grilled octopus and moussaka are served on the spacious patio or in the open, airy dining room that feels as refreshing as a breeze from the Aegean Sea.

MAKE WAY FOR DUMPLINGS

There's nothing like a dumplingwhich can be found in countless shapes, sizes and styles–to satisfy one's craving for comfort food with an international twist. And the Tri-Valley offers numerous delicious versions of this fan favorite.

Start your journey at Pacific Pearl, which opened in 2018 on Pleasanton's Stoneridge Drive. King Wah Seafood Restaurant features a variety of dumplings on its dim sum menu, including a spinach trio. Dalian Club House also provides an intimate experience for savoring fresh, boiled dumplings, while Fiery Shanghai serves up memorable Shanghai style and chili oil flavors.

In Dublin, Mayflower Restaurant features a considerable dim sum menu, and the pan-fried and steamed dumpling options-including shrimp, scallops and even sea bassare must-haves. Koi Palace at Ulferts Center was Dublin's original dim sum restaurant and serves a variety of dumpling types from northern China, including those with spinach, squid ink, beet and turmeric skins. 88 BaoBao shifted focus to noodles and steamed dumplings in 2018 and offers steamed leek, pork and shrimp dumplings, as well as pan-fried chicken and pork options. Golden Sand Harbor has a robust selection that includes everything from steamed har gow for shrimp lovers to dumplings filled with abalone and sea cucumber or scallop and tobiko.

Finish your dumpling adventure at Uncle Yu's at the Vineyard in Livermore, and enjoy the signature steamed dim sum tray featuring dumplings as diverse as shumai, pea sprout and pumpkin (with sea scallops and wild shrimp).

CULINARYEXCELLENCE

THE TRI-VALLEY IS AN AWARD-WINNING DINING DESTINATION.

The exceptional culinary scene has earned recognition at the national and even global level. Recent accolades include California Michelin Guide ratings for Sabio on Main in Pleasanton and Range Life in Livermore (the latter received a Bib Gourmand Distinction).

Sabio on Main also received a Wine Spectator Award of Excellence in 2022, as did Livermore's Posada and Uncle Yu's at the Vineyard and Danville's Forbes Mill Steakhouse.

A TASTE OF HOME

LOCANDA WINE BAR'S TULLIO ROSANO BRINGS A DELICIOUS RANGE OF DINING EXPERIENCES TO LIVERMORE.

Locanda Wine Bar chef and owner Tullio Rosano is no stranger to figuring things out on the fly. One in a family of nine children raised in Naples, Italy, he started working at age 13 (against the wishes of his mother, "Mamma Carmela") at a local restaurant, where he rose from dishwasher to line cook in just six months. So when customers at his new downtown Livermore wine bar started clamoring for some of the heartier dishes available at his family's other East Bay Locanda restaurants (located in Danville, Lafayette and Pleasanton). Rosano went to work.

Despite not having a full kitchen—no grill, just three ovens—he managed to add popular staples like lasagna, house-made cannoli, rib-eye bistecca and whole cooked branzino to what was originally conceived as a small-bites, wine-friendly menu.

"Everything has to be prepared correctly and then [baked] at just the right moment so we can deliver a nice and fresh product to the table," he says.

That the transition was so seamless—since debuting in 2021, Locanda has emerged as a go-to drinking and dining destination on hopping First Street—is a credit to Rosano's skills as a restaurateur. It's also, he says, a testament to the Livermore community, which has been "so kind and beyond welcoming."


In particular, Rosano is proud of the range of experiences available at this particular restaurant. Customers can enjoy bottle service in the lounge, pair Italian wine and cheese in the covered outdoor patio (with heat lamps for winter and spray misters in summer), have an intimate dinner at one of the indoor banquettes, or catch a game at the island bar. And one more important carryover from the other Locandas: an unwavering emphasis on hospitality.

"You can count on great service: We always try to establish a friendly environment that's good for every occasion," he says. "We try to please everyone here because they are not just our guests, they are our friends and supporters."

HERE'S THE SCOOP

SAMPLE THE TREATS ON THE TRI-VALLEY'S SWEETEST TRAIL.

- > Start your tour at Danville's **Smallcakes**. While the worldwide cupcake chain is generally known for its, well, cupcakes, stores also make multiple flavors of small-batch ice cream daily. The scoops are often inspired by Smallcakes' famous *gateau* recipes, which means pairing cake and ice cream is more than possible—it's encouraged.
- > Take a drive to Pleasanton's iconic **Meadowlark Dairy**, California's first certified dairy. Founded in the early 1900s, the store is a nostalgic throwback to the days of local milk shops. Hit the drive-thru for a cone of Meadowlark's signature soft serve ice cream (which can reach half a foot tall).
- > The Pacific Pearl retail center in Pleasanton houses **Snowflake Dessert House**, whose specialties include rolled ice cream (flavors range from matcha supreme to roasted black sesame to strawberry sunshine) and meltingly good shaved ice. You'll also find sweet and savory crepes and a wide selection of tea and coffee beverages.
- > Dig into old-fashioned treats at **Loard's** in Livermore. The creamery has been scooping up delicious cones since 1950, and it proudly proclaims it hasn't changed its ice cream recipe during those 70-plus years. Flavors run the gamut from traditional—chocolate, vanilla and butter brickle—to slightly more modern takes such as ube, sea salt caramel and green tea.



TREAT YOURSELF RIGHT



To satisfy a different kind of sweet tooth, stop by Livermore's Wingen **Bakery** and pick up a brown butter chocolate chip cookie or an apple cake. For more decadent delicacies, visit Old Towne Danville Bakery. This long-standing spot does everything from cakes to cookies; around the holidays, keep an eye out for its special menus. Excellent éclairs, cannolis and macarons are just some of the European goodies at **Primrose** Bakery in Pleasanton. Or head to premier Dublin bakery Tous les **Jours**, which serves up slices of cake that are so aesthetically pleasing that it's difficult to eat them. But not too difficult, because they taste even better than they look.

Pleasanton's **Somisomi Soft Serve and Taiyaki** offers a Korean dessert known as ah-boong, a goldfish-shaped waffle cone stuffed with soft serve and topped with options such as taro, custard and red beans. Or try the taiyaki, a warm, fish-shaped waffle treat packed with those same garnishes.

LIQUID ASSETS

Whether part of an extensive local history or at the beginning of a new movement, the region's winemakers, brewers and spirit creators are at the top of their game.



WINNER'S CIRCLE

SOME OF THE MANY AWARDS AND DISTINCTIONS EARNED BY LIVERMORE VALLEY WINES.

The wines of Livermore Valley have a long history of making their mark, starting with Cresta Blanca Winery taking the Grand Prix crown at the Paris Exposition in 1889 (see sidebar for additional Livermore Valley wine facts).

The Livermore Valley brought home 168 awards from the 2022 San Francisco Chronicle Wine Competition, the largest competition of North American wines in the world. Las Positas, Darcie Kent, Fenestra, Retzlaff, Page Mill, Garré and Wood Family were among the local favorites that took home Best of Class awards, and Livermore Valley AVA members earned multiple Gold awards as well.

AMONG THE OTHER HONORS RECEIVED BY THE LIVERMORE VALLEY AVA:

- **> Concannon Vineyard** earned a Best in Class in the Sunset International Wine Competition for its petit verdot; Fenestra, Las Positas, Murrieta's Well, Wente and Sakura Winery also earned Gold awards.
- **> McGrail Vineyards** was recognized at the Critics Challenge International Wine and Spirits Competition for its red blend and cabernet sauvignon.
- > Nottingham Cellars received Best of Show and Best Red at the 13th annual Livermore Valley Uncorked awards for its micro-lot reserve cabernet sauvignon.



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




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PICTURE PERFECT

ROSIE FIERRO OF ROSA FIERRO CELLARS FINDS CREATIVE INSPIRATION IN PHOTOGRAPHY AND WINES.

Rosa "Rosie" Fierro exudes an insatiable curiosity for the entire winemaking process, from choosing the small-lot vineyard grapes for her "big, bold, beautiful wines for beautiful people," all the way to documenting the entire process. The Danville resident's other creative outlet is photography, and her vivid shots capturing the unique patterns of wine grit left on the bottoms of stainless steel tanks can be seen on Rosa Fierro Cellars' labels and the walls of its tasting room.

"When you're taking a photograph, you're putting together in your mind what you want to capture and then trying to replicate that," she says. "Winemaking is similar: You're trying to imagine what the wine is like when it's finished and figuring out what to do so that it ends up that way. It's just a lot more complicated to produce."

Figuring out wine production has been an ongoing fascination for Fierro, who spent years studying, practicing and learning the ropes from other local vintners in her spare time from working full time as a legal assistant in San Francisco. She took the plunge in 2020, officially launching her winemaking facility and tasting room amid an urban-style hub of wineries and breweries on the eastern end of Livermore. Fierro has a direct hand in everything at her 100 percent women-owned operation. Most days, she can be found behind the counter of her tasting room pouring sips of Savvy 2021 sauvignon blanc, 2016 "Call Me a Cab" cabernet sauvignon and the other fruits of her labor. It's there, after all, where the picture she first envisioned in her mind of running a winery comes into the sharpest focus.

"I love meeting new people and talking in the wine room," she says. "I can share my passion for my wines, see how customers feel about them and just have a great time."

BEER PIONEER

HOW STEVE SARTORI BROUGHT CRAFT BEER BACK TO THE TRI-VALLEY.

Steve Sartori, brewer and founder of **Altamont Beer Works**, says that his journey to creating Altamont started when the economy tanked. Prior to the financial troubles that affected the U.S. in 2008, Sartori had been the manager of a wakeboard shop in Tahoe, but when the recession hit, he headed home to Livermore to work for the decades-old family trucking business.

"When I came back," Sartori explains, "I said, 'We have all these wineries; why don't we have a brewery?"

Sartori certainly fixed that in 2012, bringing Livermore its first brewery since Prohibition and paving the way for a local craft beer renaissance. It wasn't easy–90 percent of Altamont was hand-built by the Altamont team, with no outside contracting. "It was really a labor of love," says Sartori.

With its laid-back vibe and clean, flavorful beers, Altamont made a strong first impression on Tri-Valley natives and visitors new to the beer scene. In fact, the impression was so strong that the brewery expanded into the space beside its original taproom in 2018. The hashtag accompanying the Instagram announcement post seems nearly prophetic: #ifyoubuildittheywillcome.



Rent a canoe or motorboat for fishing, or cast from shore—just make sure to get a fishing permit from the park. <code>ebparks.org/parks/del_valle</code>


2. THE WEEKEND WARRIOR (MODERATE)

The views from atop **Pleasanton Ridge Regional Park** are breathtaking—literally. The hike from the Foothill Staging Area, located just off Highway 680, up to the Thermalito Trail and the Ridgeline Trail is a bit of a climb but worth the sweat. The Castleridge trailhead allows for exploration of the northern ridgeline of the park—after a steep climb, of course. *ebparks.org/parks/Pleasanton*

For those who prefer aquatic activities, you can skim over **Lake Del Valle** on a rented stand-up paddleboard (from \$20). outbackadventures.com

3. THE SUPERMAN (CHALLENGING)

If you are looking for a round with a view, it's hard to beat **The Course at Wente Vineyards** in Livermore. Grapevines and oak-dotted hills flank the Greg Norman–designed course, where golfers encounter plenty of challenges and thrills. Overlooking the tricky 18th hole, The Grill offers a casual menu and full bar. wentevineyards.com/course

For more great risk/reward play, head to the back nine at Pleasanton's **Callippe Preserve Golf Course**. The greens are complex, so be sure to treat yourself with a visit to the Vista Restaurant, which offers sandwiches, burgers and a view of the surrounding nature preserve. *playcallippe.com*

Rees Jones designed the gorgeous **Poppy Ridge** on 3,000 acres in Livermore, with three nine-hole courses that demand the best from players. Afterward, take in the scenery over lunch at The Grill. *poppyridgegolf.com*

The nine-hole course at **Pleasanton Golf Course** at the Alameda County Fairgrounds is suited to all abilities and budgets. Perfect your swing at the facility's nearby driving range and recharge at the clubhouse, which serves salads, sandwiches and beverages. *pleasantongolfcenter.com*

With nine- and 18-hole options, **Las Positas Golf Course** in Livermore offers both challenge and fun. Its signature hole nine is a dogleg left par 4 measuring 427 yards. Raise a glass after the game at the course's lively and family-oriented Beeb's Sports Bar & Grill. *laspositasgolfcourse.com*

With lots of par 3s, **Dublin Ranch Golf Course** is a shorter course that is long on interest, offering a few surprises as well as great wraparound views. At the course's snack bar, order burgers, sandwiches, nibbles and a selection of beverages. *dublinranchgolf.com*

ENJOY THE AREA'S RUSTIC BEAUTY ON TWO WHEELS.

IRON HORSE REGIONAL TRAIL

The 20-foot-wide paved trail is a flat, easy ride that goes through Danville, Dublin and Pleasanton. Great for a leisurely trip, the route connects directly to the Dublin/Pleasanton BART station.

DEL VALLE REGIONAL PARK

For spectacular lakeside vistas and trails of varying difficulty, head to Del Valle Regional Park. Try the outand-back ride along the east side of the lake for a route with challenging climbs and exhilarating dips.

MOUNT DIABLO STATE PARK

These museums and education centers will spark a sense of wonder about the past, present and future.

BLACKHAWK MUSEUM

The main event at this Danville establishment is a rotating fleet of iconic cars. Other sections spotlight the spirit of the Old West, China's rich history and African art. The latest addition, World of Nature, focuses on the planet's diverse species and ecosystems. *blackhawkmuseum.org*

MUSEUM ON MAIN

Delve into Pleasanton's history with artifacts and images of the Ohlone people, Spanish and Anglo settlers, World War II's expanding population, and today's dwellers. Rotating exhibitions add layers of historical depth, while a kids' corner provides hands-on activities. The museum also hosts free walking tours and the annual Ghost Walk, showcasing the town's most haunted sites every Halloween. *museumonmain.org*

EUGENE O'NEILL NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE

Eugene O'Neill, the only American playwright to win a Nobel Prize, reached the peak of his powers at Danville's Tao House, which he built on

158 bucolic acres in 1937, and where he lived through 1944. Here, he wrote *Long Day's Journey into Night* and *The Iceman Cometh*, among other masterworks. Combining elements of Asian and Spanish design, Tao House is now a museum where you can view O'Neill's desk, manuscripts and photos; in September, the Eugene O'Neill Festival showcases live performances. *nps.gov/euon, eugeneoneill.org*

MUSEUM OF THE SAN RAMON VALLEY


