

STOP

A quick take on the Mount Diablo region's extraordinary towns.

WHERE SMALL-TOWN CHARM MEETS BIG-CITY STYLE DANVILLE

Take a stroll along bustling Hartz Avenue in downtown Danville and experience the relaxed yet polished vibe for yourself. The town's vibrant center features chic shops, regional theater productions and art shows, cosmopolitan drinking spots, and top-notch restaurants. Venture away from the hub and you'll find cultural draws such as Tao House (the one-time residence of playwright Eugene O'Neill, where his plays live on during the annual Eugene O'Neill Festival), as well as Danville's numerous hiking trails, parks and open spaces.

Downtown Danville is home to

history-rich attractions such as

the Museum of the San Ramon Valley.

THE CROSSROADS OF THE BAY AREA DUBLIN

Perfectly situated at the connection of two major freeways, Dublin is one of the fastest-growing cities in the United States. Along with its diverse culinary scene, the city offers shops, nightlife and recreational opportunities for fun-seekers of all ages, including golf, bowling, ice-skating, go-kart racing, and a water park and trampoline park. There's history here, too: Witness Dublin's annual St. Patrick's Day Celebration, which recognizes the Irish heritage of the city's founders. Look for shamrocks adorning street signs in honor of those early immigrants from the Emerald Isle. The city even welcomed a new professional baseball team, the aptly named Dublin Leprechauns, in 2023.

RAISE A GLASS IN WINE COUNTRY

LIVERMORE

Forget Napa and Sonoma. California's oldest wine-growing region, Livermore is a world-class destination with dozens of wineries-most of which have been family owned and operated for generations. Livermore is not just for wine aficionados, though. There is a wide selection of craft breweries and trendy restaurants, along with plenty of kid-friendly attractions, including mini golf, super slides and laser tag. Livermore is also host to the annual Intermediate League World Series, featuring baseball all-stars, ages 11 to 13. Shoppers flock to the San Francisco Premium Outlets and specialty boutiques downtown. Sample Livermore's rich cultural offerings by catching a show at the Bankhead Theater.

LIVING WELL PLEASANTON

Once a Wild West hideout, contemporary Pleasanton has a plethora of dining, retail options and outdoor activities. The city's idyllic environment has earned it consistent accolades as one of the most desirable places to live in the state. Shopaholics can browse Stoneridge Shopping Center and Main Street boutiques, while food lovers have their pick of restaurants featuring fabulous fare from around the globe. Pleasanton also has a happening downtown; 1,200 acres of parks, open space and trails; and plenty of cultural events, including engaging performances at the Firehouse Arts Center year-round. St. Patrick's Day celebrants go for the green at Dublin's annual festival.



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COMMUNITY CULTURE

The distinctive culture of the Tri-Valley area dates back centuries. Its history, filled with frontierspeople and immigrants, has fostered a unique spirit of local pride, collaboration and innovation that lives on to this day.

A CARLEY REAL

HISTORY COMES ALIVE

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IN THE TRI-VALLEY, EVERYTHING IS DEEPLY CONNECTED TO THE PAST.

Historical insights can be gleaned in every town throughout the Tri-Valley. For instance, the **Dublin Heritage Park & Museums** is a 10-acre area that is home to **Pioneer Cemetery**; the region's oldest Catholic church, **St. Raymond** (1859); the **Murray Schoolhouse**; and the **Kolb House**, a 1910 Craftsman bungalow that now operates as a museum. **Dublin Camp Parks Military History Center** preserves the old military base, which was known as Fleet City during World War II.

In Danville, an oak tree thought to be more than 350 years old stands on Diablo Road, and its likeness serves as the town's logo. The historic 1891 **Southern Pacific Railroad Depot** nearby houses the **Museum of the San Ramon Valley**.

In Pleasanton, sign up for a historical walking tour with the **Museum on Main**. Don't miss **Alviso Adobe**, a community park that offers a rich interpretive history of the Amador Valley, from its Native American roots to the present day.

Even the wines here are steeped in tradition. Wente Vineyards, which started in 1883, produced the first labeled chardonnay, sauvignon blanc and semillon in the country. Today, most of the chardonnay grapes in California descend from Wente clones. Concannon Vineyard, founded the same year, made one of the first Bordeaux-style wines in California. Clones of its California cabernet provided the basis for the cab frenzy of the past 40 years.

In addition, the area boasts numerous historic homes, such as Pleasanton's **Century House**–which is more than 150 years old–and **Ravenswood** in Livermore (available for weddings and events).





MADE IN THE TRI-VALLEY

TAKE HOME UNIQUE PRODUCTS FROM THESE LOCAL PURVEYORS.

The Tri-Valley has been a hotbed of innovation and creativity for decades, celebrated as being the home of some of California's first viticultural pioneers, world-renowned scientific researchers and even a Nobel Prize winner. Today it continues to attract artists, farmers, chefs, winemakers and more who cultivate, curate and craft their locally made goods. When visiting, stop by some of the following makers, and take a piece of this special region home with you.

- > Those who can't resist a sweet treat should head to **Danville Chocolates**. Loved by locals for their confectionery excellence, the talented chocolatiers at this downtown shop serve up an assortment of delicacies, including truffles, chocolate barks, dipped fruits and more. *danvillechocolates.com*
- Artisanal honey is the perfect addition to your favorite snack, warm drink or charcuterie board. Gerard'z Honeybees not only produces its raw honey from native wildflowers, it also provides valuable cross-pollination to regional food growers. The honey is available for purchase at a variety of wineries and boutiques or online. gerardzhoneybees.com
- > Sweet Hope Soap Co. specializes in handcrafted soaps, face masks and other body products made with sustainable ingredients. Find its small-batch products at makers fairs, area boutiques and online. *sweethopesoapco.com*





BRIGHT IDEAS

LIVERMORE, HOME TO THE SMARTEST SQUARE MILE ON EARTH, IS WHERE YOU WILL FIND GROUNDBREAKING NEW CONCEPTS AND HISTORIC ARTIFACTS.

There have been many great achievements rooted in the Tri-Valley over the years, but one of the biggest might be the first-ever demonstration of controlled nuclear fusion ignition by **Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory** (LLNL), often called the smartest square mile on earth.

The breakthrough took place at the Livermore-based National Ignition Facility late at night on December 5, 2022, and within days, the moment made headlines around the globe. Department of Energy Secretary Jennifer M. Granholm called it "one of the most impressive scientific feats of the 21st century." The effort is a key step on the journey toward limitless clean energy.

LLNL is a federally funded research and development center that was initially established in 1952. Today, the lab continues to be at the forefront of nuclear advancements and security, along with cutting-edge ideas across a variety of other scientific fields. Visitors can get an inside look at its work at the LLNL Discovery Center (see page 45 for more). *llnl.gov*

Coincidentally, Livermore is also the site of the planet's longest-burning light bulb, according to Guinness World Records. This humble bulb– nicknamed the **Centennial Light**–can be seen at Livermore Fire Station No. 6 on East Avenue. It was first turned on in 1901 and has been switched off only four times in the ensuing years. Originally a 60-watt light, it's dimmed but still hanging on at 4 watts. Visitors are welcome, depending on the availability of firefighters to let them inside; the bulb is also visible through one of the station's windows. *centennialbulb.org*







For breakfast like Mom used to make, look no further than **Denica's Real Food Kitchen** in Livermore and Dublin for decadent favorites like waffles, omelets and giant cinnamon rolls.

BRUNCHING OUT

Open early on the weekends (take advantage to avoid the crowds), **Mayflower Restaurant** in Dublin creates a transporting experience with its inviting atmosphere and authentic dim sum menu. If you're feeling adventurous, head over to **Blossom Bee**, also in Dublin. The Thai fusion creperie puts a twist on breakfast food with dishes like the Dublin Rancheros crepe with grilled chicken and scrambled eggs.

Baci Bistro & Bar, in downtown Pleasanton, specializes in steak, seafood and Italian cuisine, but the weekend brunch menu is something really special. Try the fried egg avocado toast or steak tostadas.

Enjoy the sweet scents of morning in the Tri-Valley at **Nonni's Bistro**, an open-air, European-style eatery in Pleasanton. Both breakfast and brunch are served on weekends, giving plentiful takes on the first meal of the day.

BREAKFAST OF CHAMPIONS

THE CLASSICS

The Riata Diner & Tavern in Livermore reflects the area's pioneer past with Wild West–inspired decor and memorabilia–and serves hearty breakfast dishes. For more quirky furnishings and no-frills food to start your day, check out **Jim's Country Style Restaurant** in Pleasanton. The popular diner (there can be a line at the door on weekends) features wood–paneled walls, street signs as art and mouthwatering all-day breakfast items.

Monica's Livermore, located in a historic building, offers generously portioned breakfasts, including French toast made with house-baked bread. Consider having your meal on the spacious outdoor patio.

Follow the locals to Danville's **Sideboard Neighborhood Kitchen and Coffee Bar**, a premier cafe that features deluxe brands such as Sightglass, Temple and more. Indulge yourself with an order of beignets to go. **Crumbs** is

TAKE IT EASY

With its homey menu and refined decor, **Tri Valley Bistro** on Pleasanton's Main Street is the perfect spot to unwind. Indulge in a glass of wine as you sample the delicious New American cuisine. Also in Pleasanton, **Bocado: Un Petit Bistro** serves elevated crepes with traditional and inventive flavors.

Enjoy a taste of something different at **The Banana Garden Malaysian Cuisine** in Dublin. The flavorful Malaysian menu includes boldly spiced items like belacan string beans and tender chicken satay, while the saltwater aquarium and painted palm trees create a soothing tropical vibe.

For a culinary adventure south of the border, Livermore's family-owned **Posada Alta Cocina** is a solid bet. A contemporary take on Southwestern food, Posada is a great lunchtime stop before a day of wine tasting.

Since opening in 2016, **Danville Harvest** has earned a lot of buzz–and deservedly so. Embracing the farm-to-table concept, the charming restaurant

Break up your day with a culinary journey to Myanmar. Top dishes on the robust Burmese menu at **Burma! Burma!** in Dublin include tea leaf salad, garlic noodles, and pork and vegetable curries. Try the black sticky rice for dessert.

serves a delicious menu centered on seasonal ingredients.

Lunch in style at Pleasanton's **Oasis Wine Lounge**. The exotic interior space, with rich red accents throughout, and inviting patio are ideal for dining à deux or with a group. The Mediterranean menu with a modern flair includes lamb lollipops, pumpkin borani, gyros and kebabs.

Opened in 1997, **Blue Agave Club** was the first restaurant in Pleasanton to showcase Mexican cuisine. More than 20 years later, the popular spot is well-known for its 100 percent blue agave tequila margaritas as well as its enchanting outdoor dining experience.

Demiya is a welcome new addition to the Dublin dining scene, dishing out Japanese curry, udon, katsu and more in an airy, fastcasual space on Village Parkway.


POWER LUNCH

For authentic Southeast Asian cuisine, Experience Burma in Pleasanton has got you covered. Dining family style is recommended-and the best way to sample multiple dishes-so grab some friends and dig into the pumpkin pork stew or lemongrass tofu. In Livermore, Uncle Yu's at the Vineyard's remarkable wine list perfectly complements Szechuan staples and delectable dim sum.

If you like some action with your meal, try **Da Boccery** in Livermore. In addition to its menu featuring pizzas, sandwiches and salads, the eatery offers bocce courts, shuffleboard and axe throwing, among other games.

Prefer to kick back and relax? **Danville Brewing Co.** is your spot. The restaurant boasts exceptional pub food as well as award-winning beers like 925 Blonde and Chux Double IPA.

Best Bites / DINNER



THE BIG MEAL

THE REGION'S DINING SCENE INCLUDES EXCITING NEW RESTAURANTS AND POPULAR STANDARDS—OFFERING COSMOPOLITAN CUISINE TO PAIR WITH LIVERMORE VALLEY'S MANY FINE WINES.

THE CLASSICS

The Tri-Valley has its share of trusted eateries, including **Terra Mia Ristorante Italiano** in Livermore, which serves authentic Italian fare such as housemade pasta, pizza and other favorites in a welcoming space. Newer to the Livermore scene is **Range Life**. The Michelin-rated restaurant is located in a restored 1800s carriage house–mixing urban and rustic sensibility in food and atmosphere. The seasonally changing menu draws influences from diverse cuisines, and its craft cocktails are an excellent way to round off an evening on the town.

Pleasanton's 1950s steakhouse **Hap's Original** allows for dining in style and comfort. While steak is most definitely the focus here, with the finest dry-aged cuts of beef, the house-made sauces and dressings help elevate already scrumptious dishes. For a deep-dish experience in Pleasanton, look no further than **Zachary's Chicago Pizza**; the local mainstay adds a Californian touch to the beloved Chicago-style pie.

WORLDLY WONDERS

Sophistication is on the menu at Danville newcomer **Zaya Thai Pantry**. The restaurant features a striking open interior with a picturesque bar area. The food is as impeccably presented as it is cooked—the signature khao soi noodle soup topped by a bone-in short rib is almost too pretty to eat.

Bridges Restaurant & Bar is a paragon in the Danville culinary world, but classic doesn't mean stuffy. The polished, upscale restaurant, which was featured as a location in the 1993 comedy *Mrs. Doubtfire*, has maintained its buzz-worthy status by fine-tuning its fresh California cuisine with Asian influences.

Get a taste of Jordan at Livermore's **Petra**. This family-owned eatery is good for those trying Middle Eastern cuisine for the first time as well as more experienced eaters. The excellent complimentary cardamom tea and pita are also worth mentioning.

Ultrafresh sushi and high-end Japanese fare can be found at **Amakara** in Dublin, where chef Eddy Imano takes as much pride in his colorful presentations as he does in his tempting rolls.

HOT SPOTS

Dublin's **Berevino Italian Pub** specializes in oldworld Italian cuisine and an extensive wine list; it's a great place to have a romantic dinner or sip reds with a big group of friends.

The team behind Forbes Mill Steakhouse has found inspiration in the ocean with **Tides** in downtown Danville. The modern menu includes pasta, seasonal oysters, whole fish dishes and aquatic-themed craft cocktails. Try the perfectly tender King Ora salmon or well-spiced crab cakes.

The Yellow Chilli, from celebrity chef Sanjeev Kapoor, offers outstanding gastronomic tours of India in his Danville and Livermore locations. The restaurants, while remaining approachable for families, exude an elegant atmosphere–and the food is equally noteworthy. Try the rich butter chicken or amritsari machchi–a delicious Punjabi spin on British fried fish. Also in Danville, **Revel Kitchen & Bar** has been a smash with city sophisticates. The upscale tavern in downtown features bar bites and small plates, as well as heartier entrees and can't-miss desserts.

Sabio on Main, with its delectable dishes and large bar, has become a go-to spot in Pleasanton. Try the three- or five-course prix fixe dinner or treat yourself to executive chef Francis Hogan's 10-course tasting menu for the ultimate dining experience.

Elia is another sophisticated standout in Pleasanton. Thoughtful takes on Mediterranean favorites such as grilled octopus and moussaka are served on the spacious patio or in the open, airy dining room that feels as refreshing as a breeze from the Aegean Sea.

> Tucked into Livermore's downtown district, **Sons of Liberty Alehouse** stands out. The menu is typical of gastropubs, but the execution is a cut above–with main courses that include some unusual complementary sides and take full advantage of fresh, seasonal ingredients.


THE TRI-VALLEY IS AN AWARD-WINNING DINING DESTINATION.

THE PERFECT MIX

CHEF MAURICE DISSELS BRINGS ECLECTIC GUYANESE CUISINE TO PLEASANTON AT HIS LIVELY EATERY, OYO.

Among palm fronds and a map of Guyana, the portrait of a woman in a yellow hat looms large over the dining room of Oyo in downtown Pleasanton. She is Oyo, the grandmother of founder and executive chef Maurice Dissels and the force behind one of his earliest childhood memories: tasting her spicy chili sauce.

Dissels's restaurant is inspired by his grandmother's food philosophy– she dubbed it *muxalace*, meaning *let's lace this pot up with a little bit of everything*–and eclectic Guyanese cuisine. He hails from Guyana, located on the northern coast of South America. Its population includes people of Indian, African, European and Chinese descent, as well as several Indigenous tribes; this diversity is reflected in Guyanese food, and in Oyo's.

The menu includes curries from Eastern Asia; a West African pepper pot, filled with braised short rib and salted pork; and South American– style paella–four kinds, in fact: traditional, vegan, "del Negra" (with black squid ink), and seafood. There is also generous representation of Caribbean island cuisine, from jerk half chicken with citrus mayo to Run Down Fish: oven-baked sea bass with coconut cream and white wine.

The dessert selection features several fun finishes, including a decadent banana bread pudding with pineapple glaze and coconut ice cream. Even more fun is the live Caribbean music that plays on select evenings, as well as the occasional bottomless red wine sangria specials.

The restaurant is quite different from Birk's, the classic Santa Clara steakhouse where Dissels served as executive chef for 15 years. But at Oyo, he's clearly home—the passion for his family and heritage imbuing the food and drawing crowds of happy diners.

Best Bites / DESSERT

HERE'S THE SCOOP

SAMPLE THE TREATS ON THE TRI-VALLEY'S SWEETEST TRAIL.

> Start your tour at Danville's Lottie's Creamery. The locally based sweet shop serves ice cream made in-house from fresh, seasonal ingredients. Look for cool treats in creative flavors such as oatmeal raisin cookie, vanilla salted almond toffee, Ethiopian coffee and chocolate zinfindel. Sundaes, ice-cream sandwiches and floats are also on the tempting menu.

> Pleasanton's **SomiSomi Soft Serve and Taiyaki** offers a Korean dessert known as ah-boong, a goldfish-shaped waffle cone stuffed with soft serve and topped with options such as taro, custard and red beans. Or try the taiyaki, a warm, fish-shaped waffle treat packed with those same garnishes.

> For a spot promising the "finest all natural ice cream in the world," visit **Kwality Ice Cream** in Dublin, where specialties include eggless ice-cream cakes, sugar-free scoops, and kulfi (traditional Indian ice cream) in flavors such as kesari pista (think pistachio with a touch of saffron) and mango. You can also try cassata: three layers of ice cream topping a slice of sponge cake.

> Dig into old-fashioned treats at Loard's in Livermore. The creamery has been scooping up cones since 1950, and proudly proclaims it hasn't changed its ice cream recipe during those 70-plus years. Flavors run the gamut from traditional-chocolate, vanilla and butter brickle-to slightly more modern takes such as ube, sea salt caramel and green tea.



TREAT YOURSELF RIGHT



To satisfy a different kind of sweet tooth, stop by Livermore's Wingen **Bakery** and pick up a fig pop tart or orange spiced coffee cake. For more decadent delicacies, visit Old Towne Danville Bakery. This long-standing spot does everything from cakes to cookies; around the holidays, keep an eye out for its special menus. Excellent éclairs, cannolis and macarons are just some of the European goodies at Primrose **Bakery** in Pleasanton. Or head to premier Dublin bakery **Tous les** Jours, which serves up slices of cake that are so aesthetically pleasing it's difficult to eat them. But not too difficult, because they taste even better than they look.

Take a drive to Pleasanton's iconic **Meadowlark Dairy**, California's first certified dairy. Founded in the early 1900s, it is a nostalgic throwback to the days of local milk shops. Hit the drive-through for a cone of Meadowlark's signature soft serve ice cream (which can reach half a foot tall).





The wines of Livermore Valley have a long history of making their mark, starting with Cresta Blanca Winery taking the Grand Prix crown at the Paris Exposition in 1889 (see sidebar for additional Livermore Valley wine facts).

The Livermore Valley brought home 174 awards from the 2023 San Francisco Chronicle Wine Competition, the largest competition of North American wines in the world. Almost Famous Wine Company, Concannon Vineyard, Dante Robere Vineyards, Darcie Kent Estate Winery, Las Positas Vineyards, McGrail Vineyards and Wood Family Vineyards got Best of Class awards, while Livermore Valley AVA members earned multiple gold awards.





Curt Pipes, assistant general manager and chef at Livermore's Las Positas Vineyards, believes the experience of visiting his winery should be open to all.

"We are family-friendly and dog-friendly, and want everyone to feel welcome here," Pipes says. "We want to have an upbeat, positive environment where everyone can have fun."

An old-world vibe, award-winning wines, a spacious patio overlooking the vineyards, live music on Friday and Saturday evenings, and a tempting menu of small bites are just some of the attractions at Las Positas.

The winery first introduced charcuterie plates and table service to wine-tasting visitors in June 2020; now Pipes has expanded the dining space and created a curated menu that pairs perfectly with the small-lot wines from Las Positas winemaker Brent Amos.

BEER PIONEER

HOW STEVE SARTORI BROUGHT CRAFT BEER BACK TO THE TRI-VALLEY.

Steve Sartori, brewer and founder of **Altamont Beer Works**, says that his journey to creating Altamont started when the economy tanked. Prior to the financial troubles that affected the U.S. in 2008, Sartori had been the manager of a wakeboard shop in Tahoe, but when the recession hit, he headed home to Livermore to work for the decades-old family trucking business.

"When I came back," Sartori explains, "I said, 'We have all these wineries; why don't we have a brewery?'"

Sartori certainly fixed that in 2012, bringing Livermore its first brewery since Prohibition and paving the way for a local craft beer renaissance. It wasn't easy–90 percent of Altamont was hand-built by the Altamont team, with no outside contracting. "It was really a labor of love," says Sartori.

With its laid-back vibe and clean, flavorful beers, Altamont made a strong first impression on Tri-Valley natives and visitors new to the beer scene. In fact, the impression was so strong that the brewery expanded into the space beside its original taproom several years ago. The hashtag accompanying the Instagram announcement post about the expansion seems nearly prophetic: #ifyoubuildittheywillcome.


2. THE WEEKEND WARRIOR (MODERATE)


The views from atop **Pleasanton Ridge Regional Park** are breathtaking–literally. The hike from the Foothill Staging Area, located just off Highway 680, up to the Thermalito Trail and the Ridgeline Trail is a bit of a climb but worth the sweat. The Castleridge trailhead allows for exploration of the northern ridgeline of the park–after a steep climb, of course. *ebparks.org/parks/Pleasanton*

For those who prefer aquatic activities, you can skim over **Lake Del Valle** on a rented stand-up paddleboard (from \$20). *outbackadventures.com*

3. THE SUPERMAN (CHALLENGING)

If you are looking for a round with a view, it's hard to beat **The Course at Wente Vineyards** in Livermore. Grapevines and oak-dotted hills flank the Greg Norman-designed course, where golfers encounter plenty of challenges and thrills. Overlooking the tricky 18th hole, The Grill has a casual menu and full bar. *wentevineyards.com/course*

For more great risk/reward play, head to the back nine at Pleasanton's **Callippe Preserve Golf Course**. The greens are complex, so be sure to treat yourself with a visit to the Vista Restaurant, which offers sandwiches, burgers and a view of the surrounding nature preserve. *playcallippe.com*

Rees Jones designed the gorgeous **Poppy Ridge** on 3,000 acres in Livermore, with three nine-hole courses that demand the best from players. Afterward, take in the scenery over lunch at The Grill. *poppyridgegolf.com*

The nine-hole course at **Pleasanton Golf Course** at the Alameda County Fairgrounds is suited to all abilities and budgets. Perfect your swing at the facility's nearby driving range and recharge at the clubhouse, which serves salads, sandwiches and beverages. *pleasantongolfcenter.com*

With nine- and 18-hole options, **Las Positas Golf Course** in Livermore promises both challenge and fun. Its signature hole nine is a dogleg left par 4 measuring 427 yards. Raise a glass after the game at the course's lively and family-oriented Beeb's Sports Bar & Grill. *laspositasgolfcourse.com*

With lots of par 3s, **Dublin Ranch Golf Course** is a shorter course that is long on interest, supplying a few surprises as well as great wraparound views. At the course's snack bar, order burgers, sandwiches, nibbles and a selection of beverages. *dublinranchgolf.com*

IRON HORSE REGIONAL TRAIL

The 20-foot-wide paved trail is a flat, easy ride that goes through Danville, Dublin and Pleasanton. If you want added speed, zip along the trail on an electric bike from Pedego Electric Bikes in Livermore.

DEL VALLE REGIONAL PARK

For spectacular lakeside vistas and trails of varying difficulty, head to Del Valle Regional Park. Try the outand-back ride along the east side of the lake for a route with challenging climbs and exhilarating dips.

MOUNT DIABLO STATE PARK

For off-road enthusiasts, Mount Diablo State Park offers a handful of mountain biking trails, featuring steep hills, thrilling descents and the Diablo sunflower–a rare indigenous plant. Make sure to visit Rock City and the wind caves.

The main event at this Danville establishment is a rotating fleet of iconic cars. Other sections spotlight the Old West, China's rich history, a collection of fine makeup compacts, African art and *World of Nature*–which focuses on the planet's diverse species and ecosystems. *blackhawkmuseum.org*

DUBLIN CAMP PARKS MILITARY HISTORY CENTER

This museum-quality history center offers visitors the opportunity to learn about the Camp Parks military base–established during World War II– which helped transform Dublin from a rural community into the dynamic city it is today. *dublin.ca.gov/1916*

DUBLIN HERITAGE PARK & MUSEUMS

Clustered on 10 acres, a Craftsman house, a simple white church, a schoolhouse and a cemetery tell the story of the Tri-Valley in the 1800s and early 1900s. In the school, interactive exhibits reflect the region's history, and a playhouse allows for make-believe. Self-guided tours of the house provide insights into Dublin's agricultural history. *dublin.ca.gov/269*

EUGENE O'NEILL NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE

Eugene O'Neill, the only American playwright to win a Nobel Prize, reached the peak of his powers at Danville's Tao House, which he built on 158 bucolic acres in 1937, and where he lived through 1944. Here, he wrote *Long Day's Journey into Night* and *The Iceman Cometh*, among other masterworks. Combining elements of Asian and Spanish design, Tao House is now a museum where you can view O'Neill's desk, man-




